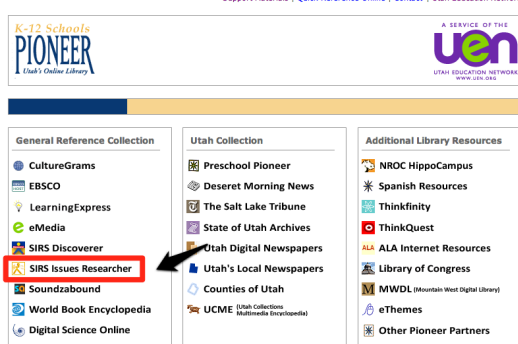
Using EBSCO & SIRS

A. Search SIRS:

1. From the school's home page at <http://ahs.canyonsdistrict.org>, pull down from the Departments tab to *Library Media Center*. Click on the Pioneer link.



2. When the Databases appear, select **SIRS Issues Researcher**. It will automatically log you in. (If you are not on the school's server, you will be brought to a login screen. You will enter the username: pioneer, password: online).

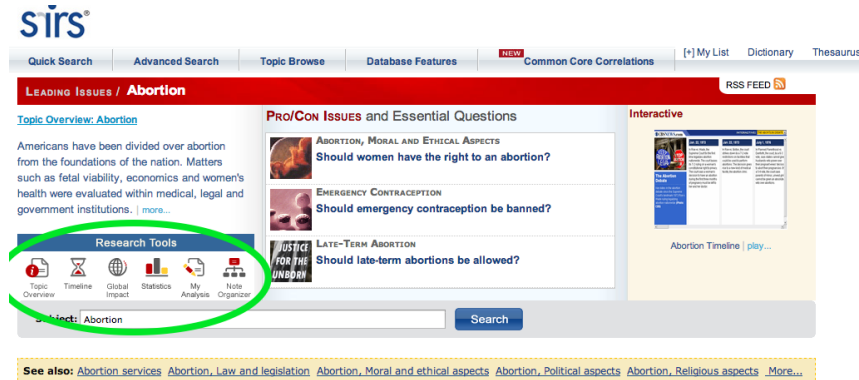


3. Key Features:

- a. Ways to Search: keyword, alphabetical list, groups, visual browse, Top 10, advanced search



- b. Helpful Tools: Topic Overview, Timeline, Global Impact, Statistics, My Analysis, Note Organizer



- c. Once you've selected an article: features, citation, find similar, email to yourself, print view

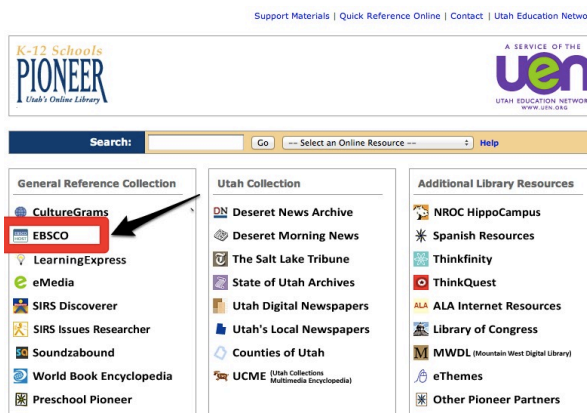


B. Search EBSCO:

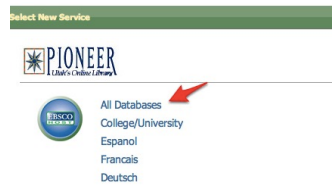
- From the school's home page at <http://ahs.canyonsdistrict.org>, pull down from the Departments tab to *Library Media Center*. Click on the pioneer link.



- When the Databases appear, select EBSCO. It will automatically log you in. (If you are not on the school's server, you will be brought to a login screen. You will enter the username: pioneer, password: online).



3. Select *All Databases*.



4. Select *Academic Search Premier*. Then click continue.

5. When the search screen for the EBSCO database appears, type your keyword search in the search window. Check the *Full Text* box under the Limit your results section. Press the <Enter> key or click on the Search button to execute your search. (Notice the many ways in which you can limit your search).
